

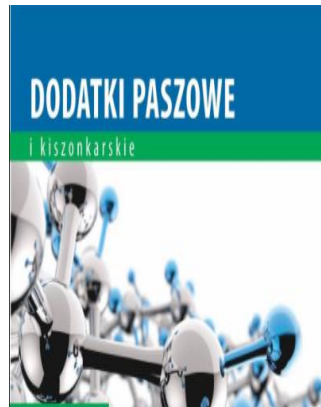

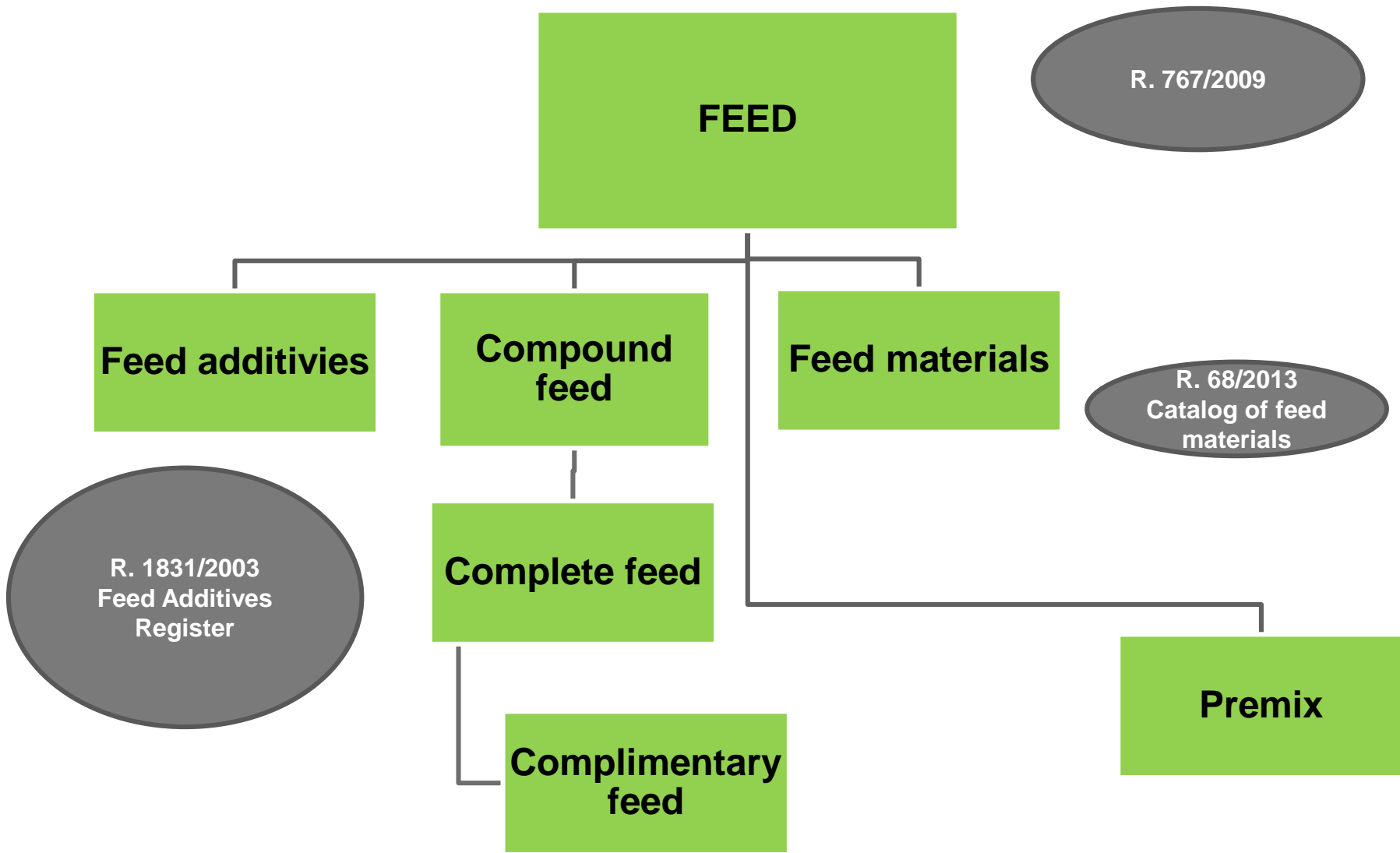

DEFINITION

REG. 178/2002

„FEED” (or „FEEDINGSTUFF”) means any substance or product, including additives, whether processed, partially processed or unprocessed, intended to be used for oral feeding to animals



Regulation (EU) 1831/2003 laying down requirements for feed hygiene

This Regulation will ensure that feed safety is considered at all stages that may have an impact on feed and food safety, including primary production.

THE PRINCIPAL OBJECTIVE OF THE NEW HYGIENE RULES SET OUT IN THIS REGULATION IS TO ENSURE A HIGH LEVEL OF CONSUMER PROTECTION WITH REGARD TO FOOD AND FEED SAFETY, TAKING PARTICULAR ACCOUNT OF THE FOLLOWING PRINCIPLES:

- **that primary responsibility for feed safety rests with the feed business operator;**
- **the need to ensure feed safety throughout the food chain, starting with primary production of feed, up to and including, the feeding of food-producing animals;**
- **the general implementation of procedures based on the principles of hazard analysis and critical control points (HACCP), which, together with the application of good hygiene practice, should reinforce feed business operators' responsibility;**
- **to ensure the traceability Feed business operators and farmers shall only source and use feed from establishments which are registered and/or approved in accordance with this Regulation.**

SUBJECT MATTER

The Regulation 183/2005 lays down:

- **general rules on feed hygiene;**
- **conditions and arrangements ensuring traceability of feed;**
- **arrangements for registration and approval of establishments.**

THE REGULATION SHALL APPLY TO:

- **the activities of feed business operators at all stages, from and including primary production of feed, up to and including, the placing of feed on the market;**
- **the feeding of food-producing animals;**
- **imports and exports of feed from and to third countries.**

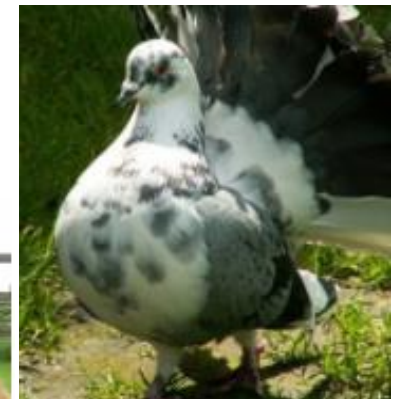
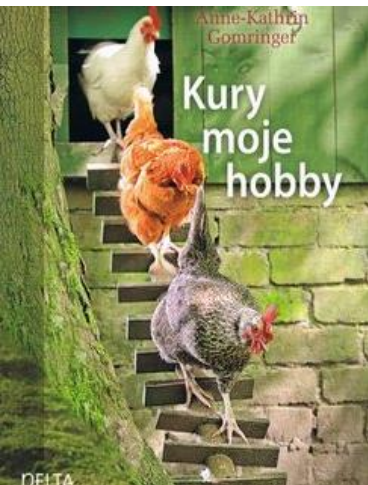
THE REGULATION SHALL NOT APPLY TO:

the private domestic production of feed:

- for food-producing animals kept for private domestic consumption;

and

- for animals not kept for food production;

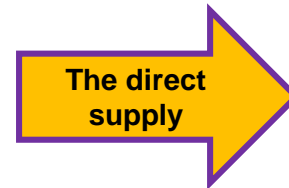


THE REGULATION SHALL NOT APPLY TO:

the feeding of food-producing animals kept for private domestic consumption;

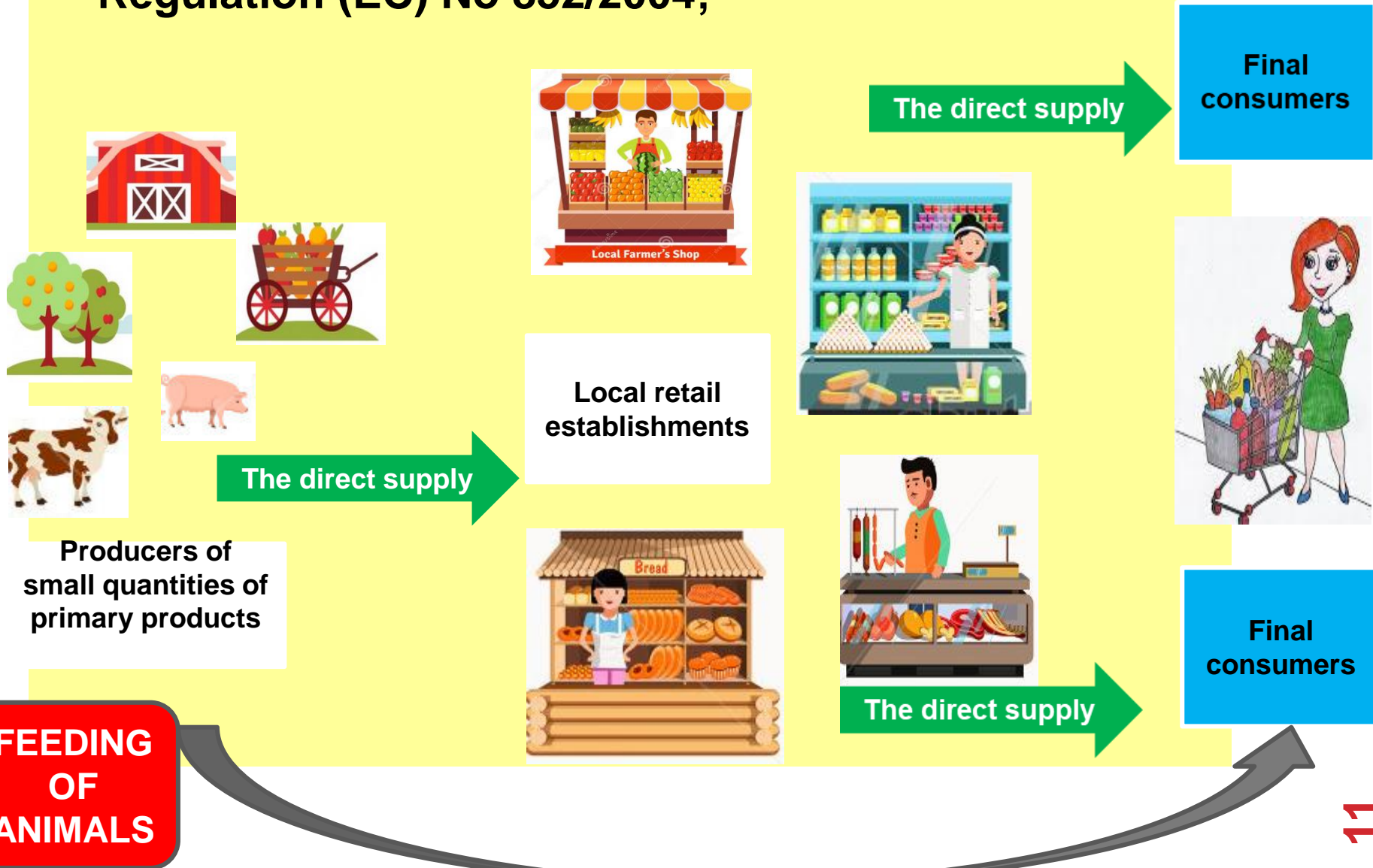


the direct supply of small quantities of primary production of feed at local level by the producer to local farms for use on those farms;



THE REGULATION SHALL NOT APPLY TO:

- For the activities mentioned in Article 1(2)(c) of Regulation (EC) No 852/2004;



**FEEDING
OF
ANIMALS**

THIS REGULATION SHALL NOT APPLY TO:

- **The feeding of animals not kept for food production;**
- **The retailing of pet food.**



PRIMARY PRODUCTION OF FEED

the production of agricultural products, including in particular growing, harvesting, milking, rearing of animals (prior to their slaughter) or fishing resulting exclusively in products which do not undergo any other operation following their harvest, collection or capture, apart from simple physical treatment.

ANNEX I:

primary production

transport, storage and handling of primary products at the place of production;

transport operations to deliver primary products from the place of production to an establishment;

mixing of feed for the exclusive requirements of their own holdings without using additives or premixtures of additives (exception of silage additives)

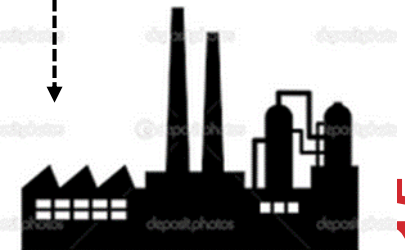

ANNEX I

Hygiene provisions;

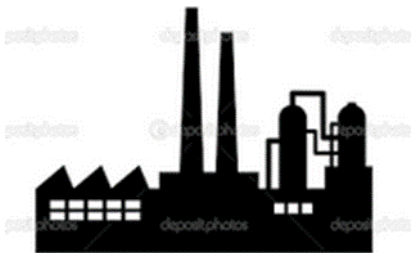
Record-keeping:

- **any use of plant protection products and biocides;**
- **use of genetically modified seeds;**
- **any occurrence of pests or diseases that may affect the safety of primary products;**
- **the results of any analyses carried out on samples taken from primary products or other samples taken for diagnostic purposes that have importance for feed safety;**
- **the source and quantity of each input of feed and the destination and quantity for each output of feed.**

SPECIFIC OBLIGATIONS

ANNEX II

For operations other than those referred to in paragraph 1, including mixing of feed for the exclusive requirements of their own holdings when using additives or premixtures of additives with the exception of silage additives, feed business operators shall comply with the provisions in Annex II, where relevant for the operations carried out.

Art. 6 (1) reg. (EC) 183/2005

Feed business operators carrying out operations other than at the level of primary production those referred to in Article 5(1) shall put in place, implement and maintain, a permanent written procedure or procedures based on the HACCP principles

- **Exception: Primary production: transport, storage and handling of primary products at the place of production, transport operations to deliver primary product from the place of production to an establishment; mixing of feed for the exclusive requirements of their own holdings without using additives or premixtures of additives with the exception of silage additives**

Art. 6 (3) reg. (EC) 183/2005

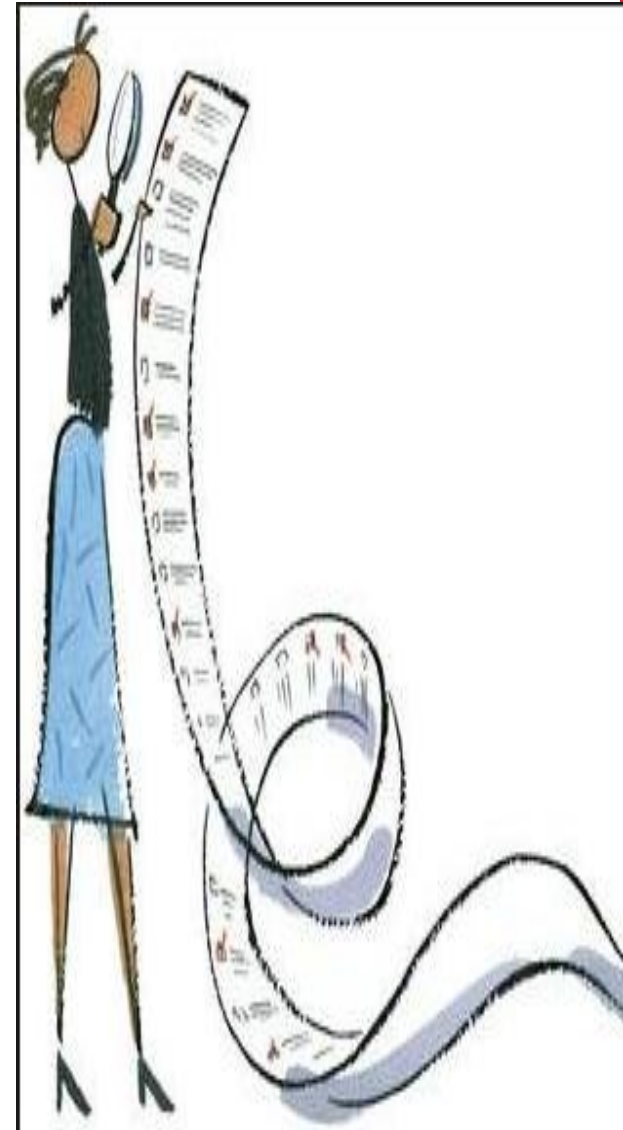
When any modification is made in a product, process or any stage of production, processing, storage and distribution, feed business operators shall review their procedure and make the necessary changes

LIST OF REGISTERED AND APPROVED ESTABLISHMENTS

For each activity, the competent authority shall record in a national list or lists the establishments it has registered in accordance with Article 9 Reg. 183/2005

Establishments approved by the competent authority in accordance with Article 10 and 13 shall be recorded in a national list, under an individual identifying number.

Member States shall keep updated the records of establishments in the lists referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 in accordance with the decisions referred to in Articles 14, 15 and 16 to suspend, revoke or amend registration or approval.

ANIMAL FEED

Guides to Good Practice

The development, dissemination and use of both national and Community guides to good practice must be encouraged. However, these guides may be used on a voluntary basis by the feed business operators.

Guidelines for the development of Community guides to good practice ^{EN} have been prepared together with the Member States.

These Community guides to good practice were developed in accordance with Article 22 of Regulation (EC) No 1831/2005 laying down requirements for feed hygiene. Their contents are practicable throughout the EU for the sector to which they refer and are suitable as guides for compliance with the hygiene and HACCP requirements of that Regulation.

EU Guides

On 29 January 2007, the Standing Committee on the Food Chain and Animal Health assessed the following Community guides to good practice:
